Morton "Keith" Greene, 87, lifelong Decatur resident, passed away July 1, 2009 at his home surrounded by his family.

Keith was born February 1, 1922, in Kirksville, son of Oliver Morton and Cecile Kidwell Greene. He graduated from Stephen Decatur High School in 1941, having attended three schools: Roach, Johns Hill, and Decatur High. He was inducted into the Army in 1941. He was proud to have served his country as a Staff Sergeant in the 96th Division of the 382nd Infantry "Deadeyes" in Leyte, Philippines, and was decorated with two bronze stars.
