

Hermann, Ambrose 921<sup>st</sup> Field Artillery

AMBROSE HERMANN MUSCATINE, Iowa - Ambrose Hermann, 82 of 1411 Lucas Street, died Tuesday, September 2, 2003, at The University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics, following a motor vehicle accident.

A Funeral Mass will be held at 11:00 a.m. on Wednesday, at the St. Mary Church, 417 Green Street. The Reverend Jack Gallagher will officiate. Burial will be in St. Mary's Cemetery. Visitation will be from 9 - 10 a.m. Wednesday at the Ralph J. Wittich-Riley-Freers Funeral Home.

Mr. Hermann was born on August 13, 1921, in Sigourney, the son of Fred and Rose Hammond Hermann. He had been a resident of Muscatine since 1944. He had worked at the Muscatine Buick Dealership as an auto mechanic for many years. He later retired in 1980 from Krieger's. He was a member of the St. Mary Church and the American Legion.

He had served in the United States Army during World War II in the Pacific Theatre, later receiving the Purple Heart.
